

Two Towns of Character

Champlitte Through Time

Once a defensive stronghold of the County of Burgundy, Champlitte boasts a rich historical and architectural heritage, carefully preserved over the centuries. Castle, museums, charming alleyways, defensive towers, a convent, wine production, and links with Mexico... these spread the town's renown internationally.

The Authentic Charm of Ray-sur-Saône

The Romans recognized the strategic position of Ray-sur-Saône, overlooking the Saône river, and settled there. The Saint-Pancras church, dating back to before 1224, with its bulbous spire, its oval wash house, its mill, its wayside crosses, its lock... all create an unusual setting in the shadow of its majestic castle.

Castles & Residences

A Museum-Castle in Champlitte

The presence of a fortified castle (regularly destroyed over the centuries) has been documented since the 12th century. The current building largely dates from the 16th and 18th centuries. Today, Champlitte Castle is owned by the Department of Haute-Saône and houses a museum.

A Castle Inherited at Ray-sur-Saone

The medieval castle was the largest fortress in Franche-Comté during the Middle Ages. A witness to a past of fire and blood, the two Romanesque towers still watch over the village. The imposing building was restored in 1700 and overlooks an English-style park. The Department inherited it upon the death of its last countess, Diane de Salverte. This true gem still houses furniture and paintings accumulated over centuries by her family, which can be discovered during guided tours.

Going Further

During your exploration, don't hesitate to take a look at the former Hôtel Grillot in Champlitte (16th century), the Beaujeu keep (12th century), a vestige of an old fortified castle, the entrance to the medieval castle of Montot, of which a carriage gate and a keep remain, and not forgetting the 'Couyba' house in Dampierre-sur-Salon, built at the end of the 18th century, where the local child, former minister, and local poet, Charles Couyba, lived.

Religious Heritage

Saint-Christophe Church of Champlitte-la-Ville (11th Scentury - IMH), with surviving elements from its original era, bears witness to a strong religious presence until the late 19th century. Also dedicated to Saint-Christophe, the church in Champlitte (IMH) was built in 1437. A fire in 1888 caused it to lose its status as the tallest bell tower (80 meters) in Haute-Saône. Today, the church houses a fresco by Alfred Giess, a local artist and Grand Prix de Rome winner. Another must-see church is in Grandecourt (12th century - MH), whose gem is its crypt, unique in Haute-Saône, its Christ in Majesty depicting the Last Judgment,

and its 13th-century frescoes. Open from Easter to All Saints' Day.

Must-See Museums

The Departmental Albert & Félicie Demard Museum in Champlitte

The Museum of Folk Arts and Traditions sheds light on traditional rural society in late 19th-century France, particularly in the Champlitte region. A wide range of themes are explored: peasant life, crafts, medicine, hunting, school, peddlers, and other itinerant trades... Two rooms are dedicated to the twinning with Mexico.



The Museum of Arts and Techniques highlights the technological changes that occurred at the very end of the 19th and the beginning of the 20th century in France and their considerable influence on the artisanal world. It is presented in the form of small reconstructed workshops, accompanied by videos showing the work of artisans : clog maker, shoemaker, garage mechanic...

Museum of Earth Sciences

In Dampierre-sur-Salon, a collection of fossils and minerals is displayed in the cellar of the Couyba house. Open year-round by reservation for groups of 5 or more.

Calvaries, fountains and wash houses

Heritage forged by men, washhouses and fountains constitute a rich artistic heritage in Franche-Comté. There are nearly 2,500 in Haute-Saône built between 1760 and 1914. Take a look at the town halls-washhouses of Beaujeu and Dampierre-sur-Salon. You will also come across many Calvaries, witnesses of the beliefs of our regions.

Unconventional Heritage

The Remarkable Savoyeux Vault

Built in the 19th century over a 54-year period, this 643-meter underground canal bears witness to the many workers who lost their lives during its construction. Today, it never fails to impress visitors. Nearby, on dry land, it also serves as the starting point for some beautiful hiking trails.

Dry Stone Walls and Vineyard Enclosures at Les Lavières in Champlitte

Named after the stones extracted from the site for roofing and the construction of dry stone walls and winegrowers huts, Les Lavières invites you to wander among its charming private enclosures and observe its modest vineyard, peacefully ripening in the sun. To keep your bearings, you can always explore an interpretive trail dedicated to the vine and

Theuley-les-Lavoncourt, Birthplace of the FIF-A World Cup

Dorn in Theuley-lès-Lavoncourt in 1873, Jules Rimet, FIFA DPresident from 1921 to 1954, was the driving force behind the first FIFA World Cup. Since 2012, the Jules Rimet Literary Prize has celebrated sports literature, both French and international. A memorial was inaugurated in 1995 in the presence of the Minister of Sports, Marie-Georges Buffet, and the first goal scorer of the 1930 World Cup, Lucien Laurent.

A Millennia-Old Vineyard in Champlitte

Since the Middle Ages, Champlitte has been a land of vineyards, once boasting approximately 500 hectares. In the late 19th century, 80% of the hillsides disappeared due to climatic conditions, competition from transportation on the Saône, and the phylloxera epidemic. However, the Saint-Vincent winegrowers festival, have been maintained every

Stroll Through Remarkable Parks and Gardens

Whether English-style and planted with century-old trees at Ray-sur-Saône Castle, or French-style, recreated in 2008 at Champlitte Castle from original plans, or generously endowed with rare plant species, including over 800 rose bushes, at Baillot Park in Vellexon-Queutrey-et-Vaudey, the parks are plentiful and offer peaceful walks.

Barefoot on Dry Grasslands



Dry grasslands are habitats of major ecological interest, managed by the Conservatoire des Espaces Naturels (Natural Areas Conservatory). They are present in Champlitte, notably at the sites of La Pâturie and Montgin (where a discovery trail has been created), but also in the areas of Argillières, Fouvent-Saint-Andoche, Roche-et-Raucourt, and Renaucourt.

The Saone and its Treasures

The Saône is a river nearly 480 km long, originating in Vioménil (88) and flowing into the Rhône in Lyon. Between sky and riverbank, you can observe its wildlife (herons, kingfishers, swans, frogs, beavers...) and its protected flora, typical of wetlands. In Autet, almost opposite the beach, you will find the Old Saône, an ancient dried-up river arm, where remarkable and protected plants thrive.



Itineraries

Heading: On the Move!

Numerous marked trails await you in the heart of a natural area ideal for this activity. Discover: dry stone and grassy landscapes, the banks of the Saône, picturesque little villages dotted with fountains, wash houses and numerous wayside crosses, peaceful woods, breathtaking viewpoints, vestiges of mysterious legends and calm and tranquil paths.

Our interpretive trails will unveil the treasures of our region: the dry stone trail in **Champlitte** (history of the 'lavières' site, vineyards, and botany), the Montgin discovery trail (dry grasslands, fauna, and flora), the Magny interpretive trail in Pierrecourt (fountains, wash houses, village heritage), and the Gall'eau Romain interpretive trail in Membrey (discovery of the natural environment and history of the territory).
